6:45pm – 7:00pm Pre-Meeting

Troop Tote Bags: The Daisies will be able to continue coloring in the pictures on the Troop Tote bags. Those that are done can play with our spiffy Groovy Girls and finger puppets!

7:00 – 7:15pm Daisy Circle and Troop Business

To transition into the Daisy Circle, we will play a Girl Scout song on the leader’s spiffy new iPod player as we are sitting and settling in. The main Troop Business will be to review the cookie sales and then begin a discussion of what it means to be “responsible for what I say and do.”

7:15 – 7:25pm Break/Physical Activity/Bathroom Break

We will play “Daisy to Daisy” while waiting for everyone to return from the bathroom!

7:25pm – 7:40pm Reading Time

Discussion before the book: What is a Bully? Ask the girls to brainstorm what they think until all ideas are exhausted. Moms can give their ideas, too. *Bullying is when a stronger person hurts or frightens a smaller or weaker person on purpose and over and over.* Do you know a bully, how do they act?

Book: The Brand New Kid.

7:40pm – 7:55pm Activity

Nice/not nice words: As a group, we will make a list of “helping” words and phrases (“please,” “thank you,” “sorry,” etc.) and “hurting” words and phrases. Which words would the girls rather speak—and hear from others?

7:50pm – 8:00pm Closing Circle

Friendship squeeze and a reminder to deliver cookie forms to cookie mom by end of the week!

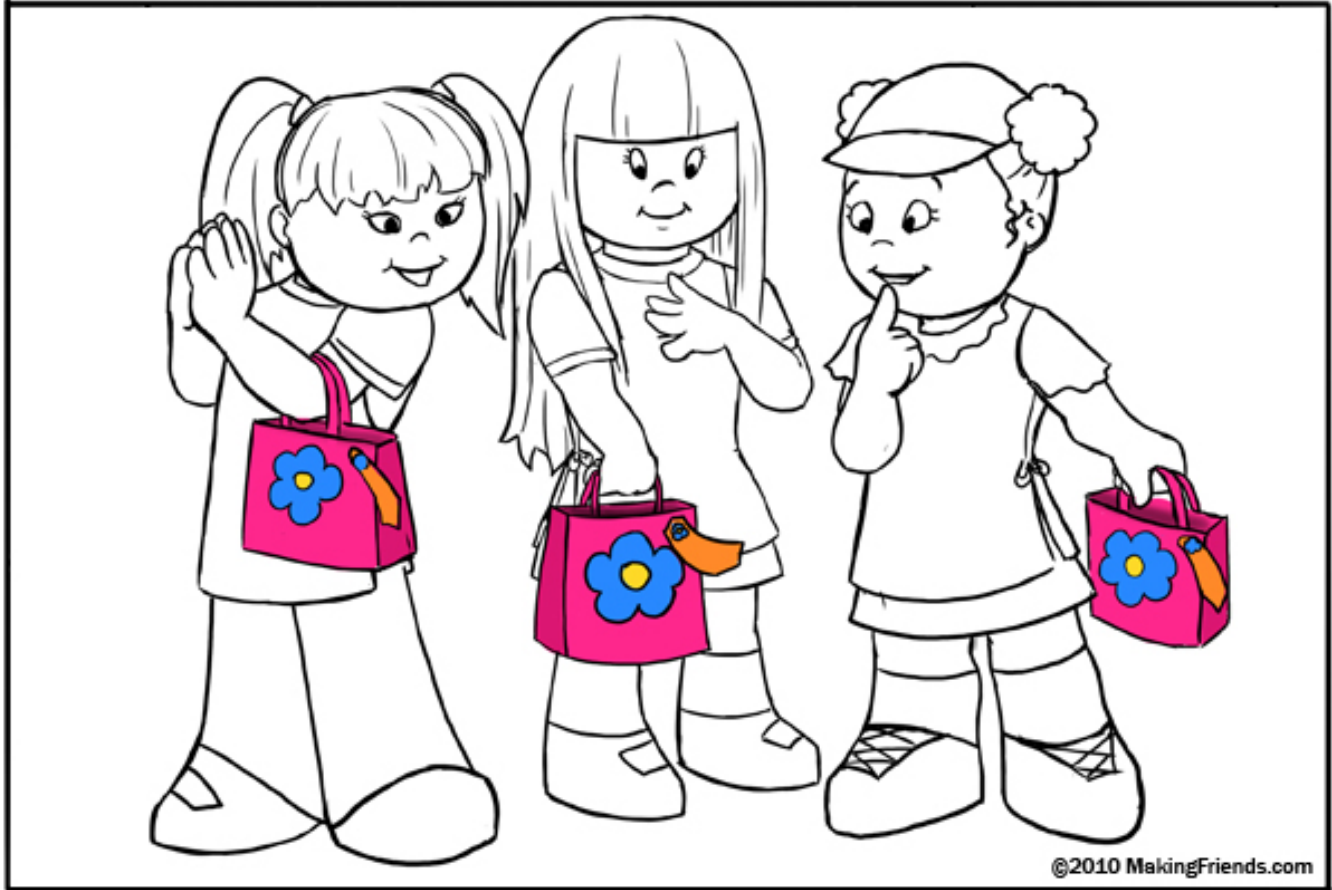
Troop 5384: Eighth Meeting Make-up Activities (to be completed at home)

The lesson for the eighth meeting is related to the concept of being “Responsible for What I Say and Do.” We will also begin work toward the “No Bullies” patch – that is, learning about what a bully is, how to not be a bully, and how to handle a bully.

1. *Responsible for What I Say and Do Coloring Sheet:* One of the activities we have been completing as a Troop is our Troop Tote Bags. Each girl is decorating her own tote bag, and we will begin to keep the girl’s Troop materials and handouts in the tote bags. The girls will become responsible for putting items they create during the meetings into the tote bags and checking the tote bags before they go home (to bring home paperwork, handouts, etc.). Explain to your Daisy that this will be a new responsibility she will have as part of the troop, and have her color in the attached coloring sheet.
2. *What is a bully?:* With your Daisy, brainstorm as to what a bully is. It might help to write down a list as you think about this. Do you know someone who acts like a bully? Ask your Daisy what she does or would do if she saw someone begin bullied.
3. *Helping and hurting words:* Being responsible for what we say means being aware of when we say things that can hurt other people’s feelings. If we aren’t careful to say nice things to people, we can turn into bullies ourselves. Use the attached sheet to help your Daisy make a list of helping words and hurting words. As her which she’d rather have said to her!

To earn credit for the “Responsible for What I Say and Do” patch and toward the “No Bullies” patch, your child will need to bring in her completed coloring sheet, and list of helping and hurting words.
